

Cannibalism By Japs. In N.G.

SAN FRANCISCO, Teesday (AAP).—The United Press correspondent says when cut off from supplies the Japancse practised cannibalism in New Guinea during actions at Buna, Gona, and Sanananda.

The correspondent says an Australian colonel showed him captured food tins containing boiled hands from which all the flesh had been picked. Also discovered were large stocks of flesh cut off Caucasian bodies wrapped in banyan leaves. There is no evidence the Japanese killed prisoners for food. They apparently used bodies not recovered by our forces.
