When Charles Frederick Hancock was born on June 18, 1911, in Conway, Arkansas, his father, Clyde, was 35 and his mother, Mary, was 32. He had two brothers and two sisters. He died on March 25, 1981, at the age of 69, and was buried in his hometown.



Rev. C. F. Hancock Passes At Longview Hospital Wednesday

Rev. C. Fred Hancock, retired minister and missionary, passed away Wednesday morning at a Longview hospital, where he was taken after an automobile accident on Friday of last week.

Mrs. Hancock received only minor injuries and was dismissed from the hospital Sunday. They made their home at Ladonia since retiring.

Rev. and Mrs. Hancock were returning from Moranch at Hunt, near Kerrville, where they had attended a Presbyterian assembly. During their stay at the assembly the couple observed their 48th wedding anniversary. Rev. and Mrs. Hancock spent twenty years in China in missionary work for the Presbyterian Church. He had served in several pastorates since returning to the United States, Hallsville being his last active work.

He was born at Austin, Ark., November 3, 1878, being 76 years of age.

In September 1906, he married Miss Mary Louise Penick, who survives with these children: Mrs. Kenneth Rowton, Honey Grove; Fred Hancock, Evansville, Ind.; E. T. Hancock, Garland, and Mrs. Mary Louise Mineur, San Antonio.

The Body will be interred at Oakwood cemetery in Honey Grove Friday.


GARLAND — Edward Penick Hancock, an Intercontinental Manufacturing Co. retiree, died Monday at a Dallas care center. He was 85.

Funeral will be at 2 p.m. Thursday at Bean-Massey-Burge Funeral Chapel in Grand Prairie. Burial will be in Moore Memorial Gardens in Arlington.

Mr. Hancock was born of missionary parents in Chingkiang, China, at the home of author Pearl Buck. The family returned to the United States when he was 12.

Mr. Hancock was a graduate of the University of Texas at Austin and taught in East Texas until World War II. During the war he joined Southern Aircraft in Garland and then Consolidated Vultee, which became General Dynamics. In 1952 he joined Intercontinental Manufacturing and retired from the company in 1970 as vice president in charge of production.

Survivors: Wife, Annabelle Bean Hancock of Garland; daughter, Kathy Pinckert of Garland; son, Bill Hancock of Richardson; sister, Katherine Rowton of Honey Grove; 10 grandchildren; and one great-grandchild.


Young Artists to Honor Federated Junior Members


