James Taylor Hughes' first wife Emily Nevada Griffin  
 Died 1898 - family moving to Mount Pleasant Farm, Norfolk, CO.  
 She bruised her finger on a flour barrel. Blood poison  
 set in the hand & brought a quick death.

James Taylor Hughes (re-married) Minnie Miller &  
 raised a second family of boys Jim (accident by  
 a shot gun killed him), Jack, Earl, Clyde, Joe.

Sally Bass 96 (Dec. 1953) Told me she knew James  
 T. Hughes. said, "he would tease her as a child,  
 if he had long curbs, he would take hold of one  
 & say let me get my pocket knife & cut one off  
 & laugh. I liked him very much & always  
 went to the store on Liberty St. when I had  
 a penny to buy some candy."

Mrs Bass told about the time she was standing  
 on the store porch & Mr Hughes was there  
 watching the Cannon Ball train pass through  
 the village. She said an old Negro man  
 in a cart with a grey mule from the  
 country was crossing the tracks. "I  
 do not know if he was deaf or what  
 but he drove the mule in front of the train  
 & sent the mule fly up in the air & the  
 cart was torn to pieces. The Negro man  
 & mule were killed. It was awful!"
