Edward Boyd To Be Ordained Baptist Minister

Seven Clergymen to Take Part in South Norfolk Rite Sunday at 3 P. M.

Edward Roland Boyd, son of Mrs. Bonnie Boyd and the late W. R. Boyd, of 2315 Princeton Avenue, Norfolk, and Washington, N. C., will be ordained to the ministry at South Norfolk Baptist Church Sunday at 3 p. m., the Rev. Frank Hughes, Jr., pastor, announced yesterday.

The Rev. Dr. Henry W. Tiffany, pastor of the Park Place Baptist Church, will deliver the ordination sermon.

John M. Roberts, choir director of the South Norfolk church, will present special music.

The host pastor will be in charge of the service, with the following five other ministers participating:

The Rev. W. A. Richardson, pastor of Back Bay Baptist Church, who will give the report of the examining council.

The Rev. Horace Twine, of South Norfolk, a student at the Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, who will deliver the invocation.

The Rev. Dr. Beecher L. Rhodes, pastor of the Berkley Avenue Baptist Church, will introduce the speaker.

The Rev. W. T. Halstead, pastor of the Broad Creek Baptist Church, will lead the ordination prayer.

The Rev. George W. Wollett, Jr., pastor of the Baptist Tabernacle Church, will present the Bible.

The Rev. Mr. Hughes, will give the formal charge to the candidate.

Boyd became a member of the Broad Creek Village Baptist Church while the Rev. Mr. Hughes was pastor there. Later, he became a member of the South Norfolk Baptist Church and was licensed to preach.

The grandson of Mrs. E. F. Stowe and the late Capt. E. F. Stowe and the late Mr. and Mrs. W. R. Boyd, Boyd was born in Washington, N. C., where he attended the public schools before his family moved to Norfolk. At the age of 15, he was graduated from Maury High School in June, 1947.
