South Korea: Seventy-seven boys and seven leaders from 14 Baptist Churches recently attended a Royal Ambassador Camp at a mountain retreat near Pusan.

Wales: The Baptist Union concluded its annual assembly with a strong evangelistic eleven hour session featuring sermons by six preachers.

Pennsylvania: Penna.-South New Jersey Baptist Fellowship now reports 65 congregations with 5,632 members. There was a 28% increase in church membership during the past year.

Billy Graham: The Graham Evangelistic Association is considering building a Bible-Oriented University. The school would train evangelist, Christian education specialists, and journalists. Needed will be 1,000 acres of land and \$50 million. Seventeen cities have already offered sites for such a school.

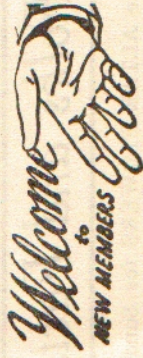
HISTORY

October 31, 1517 Martin Luther attacked his 95 thesis on the door of Wittenberg Castle Church.

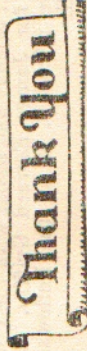
