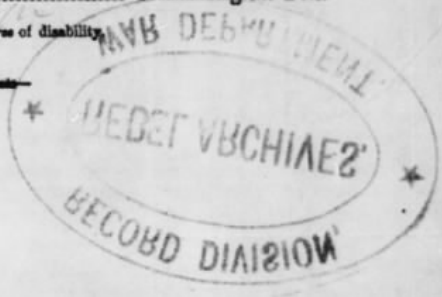

families exposed to the cruelty of our foe -

down the Mississippi River - Therefore I ask
that you give me permission to raise one
hundred such men for the service above
mentioned, and allow me to operate against
~~them~~ ^{the enemy} without being attached to any Command
I would ask that I might be Commissioned
before hand, as Captain, the rank I had
before - and that you furnish me with one
hundred muskets and ammunition and
I will furnish the rest after I have been
in the service, ^{one month} I will then ask for nothing
else but derive money from the enemy to pay
all our expenses - I hope Sir you will not
think lightly of this you can inform yourself
of my qualifications to fill such a position by
reference to Gen's Johnston & W. H. Jackson

Columbus, Georgia
September 13th 1863

To his Excellency -

I hope Sir you will not throw this aside, as you usually do such communications - For this is a time when everything which redounds to the credit of the Confederacy - should be taken with consideration by your Hon^{ble} self - I have a favor to ask of you; and ere I proceed I feel I should tell you who I am, and what I have done - I volunteered in the first company that left my native village in Mississippi and after being out some three months I was detailed by Gen. Powell as a scout with four others from the 12th Mississippi Regiment which five, composed the "Mississippi Scouts" on the Potomac. I was employed by Gen. Rhodes of the same Brigade similarly on the Peninsula, and at the Battle of "Seven Pines" lost my left arm. Returning home I was elected Probate Clerk of Clinton County. And when the Yankees landed at "Grand Gulf" I raised a company of Cavalry, ^{for a short time} was imprisoned and turned over to the Confederate States, of my services there Gen. Joseph E. Johnson can testify. The company disbanded at the expiration of this time, left me not only without a position but also a home, the enemy having destroyed everything I had -
