Church Needs Of Migrants To Be Outlined

Rev. Mark Alexander to Speak Wednesday for Missionary Society

The Rev. Mark Alexander, Jr., a recent graduate of the Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, Fort Worth, Tex., will address the February meeting of the South Norfolk Baptist Woman's Missionary Society Wednesday at 2:15 p. m., Mrs. Edna Raper, program chairman, announced yesterday.

"Strangers Everywhere" will be his topic. He will explain the need of ministry to 750,000 migrant people in the South, 95 per cent of whom are unchurched.

The Rev. Mr. Alexander is also a graduate of the South Norfolk High School and Wake Forest College, and is a former member of the South Norfolk Baptist Church.

His wife is the former Miss Cecile Price, of Corinth, Miss. Both are foreign mission volunteers but are available for pastoral work before appointment by the Southern Baptist Foreign Mission Board, of Richmond.
