HISTORY

1947 - 1972

Early in the year of 1943, Miss Louise Fletcher, a missionary of the General Baptist Association of Virginia, held a meeting the the home of Mrs. J. Barber at 4110 North Highland Avenue, Norfolk County, Virginia. The area which is now Industrial Park was then Broad Creek Village, a housing development constructed for people who came to Norfolk during the early part of World War II to work at ship yards, and military bases. From the meeting in the home of Mrs. Barber a Sunday School group was begun that later was organized as the Broad Creek Baptist Church which is now the Virginia Heights Baptist Church.

At first Broad Creek Baptist Church met in the Broad Creek rental office, and later moving to the Elementary School building. In the other end of the village, a Methodist group met in the Broad Creek High School building. For some reason the Methodists were not successful and ceased to exist.

There was a need for religious instruction and worship in the area vacated by the Methodists. At the suggestion of the manager of the village the Broad Creek Church, under the leadership of Pastor Frank Hughes, established the Nelson Park Baptist Mission. Mr. J. Otis Pruden of New Bern, North Carolina, was called as associate pastor in charge of the mission.

The mission was organized as the Nelson Park Baptist Church in 1947. Mr. Pruden continued to serve as pastor. During Mr. Pruden's pastorate a Building Fund was begun. According to Mr. James R. Hunt, charter member and treasurer for many years, it was difficult frequently for the church to meet its obligations. It was not uncommon for him to pay the bills first waiting a few weeks before paying the pastor's salary. Of course, Pastor Pruden instructed him to do this. Mr. Pruden resigned in 1951.

A call was then extended to Mr. Ernest S. Higginbotham. He served well for three years.

Mr. Wallace Avery began his pastorate in Dec. 1954. Under Pastor Avery the church purchased our present property for \$20,000.00. In August, 1955, the church changed its meeting place to the Ingleside Elementary School building located on the corner of Ingleside Road at Virginia Beach Boulevard. The name of the church was also changed to Ingleside Baptist Church. Mr. Avery resigned in August, 1958.

Between pastors the church completed the first unit of our present building. The first structure cost approximately \$85,000.00. Services were conducted in the new building for the first time on Sunday, October 4, 1958.

In March, 1958, Mr. Roy H. Silvers, II of Bolling Green, Virginia, became pastor. He served until July, 1961.

Our church was most fortunate in having United States Navy Chaplain, Billy N. Wolfe, to serve as interim pastor.

Mr. Rembert Truluck of Danville, Kentucky began his pastoral duties on June 3, 1962. As of December, 1962, the Sunday School enrollment was 448; church membership 302; and the total annual budget amounted to \$24,143.81. By October,

1965, the Sunday School enrollment reached 536; church membership 440; and the total annual budget amounted to \$42,278.00. Pastor Truluck resigned on August 31, 1965, but not before the second unit of the church building program was begun in May, 1965,

The contract for the second unit of the church building was signed on April 30, 1965, with the L. J. Hoy Construction Company, a Norfolk contractor. Architects were Williams and Tazewell and Associates of Norfolk. Mr. L. Clyde Wheaton was elected Building Committee Chairman. However, due to sickness, Mr. James E. Banks, Mr. Wayne Barnett, and Mr. Dewey Rogerson. Heading up the furnishings Committee as chairman was Mr. Curtis Koger. Mr. James A. Hall was appointed chairman of a special finance committee to negotiate a loan to retire the outstanding bonds plus the amount needed to finance the new building. The second unit was completed in January, 1966, at a cost of \$82,677.00. During the same month the building was dedicated and was first used by the Sunday School and other organizations.

A former pastor of Ocean View Baptist Church, Norfolk, Virginia, Mr. Yancy C. Elliott, who had retired from the active pastorate and had returned to Norfolk for his retirement, became interim pastor. During this interim period, Mr. Donald T. Dozier, Chairman of the Deacons, gave more of himself and his time to the church than could be expected of him. He led the church in a very special way.

On May 1, 1966, James E. Womble of Norfolk, Virginia, became Pastor. He served until June, 1971.

Once again, Mr. Yancy C. Elliott returned to serve as interim pastor until Nov. 21, 1971 when the church called Mr. Ivey C. Cook, our present pastor, to serve with us.

What does the future hold for Ingleside Baptist Church? We do not know, but we do know who holds our future! God does and He has spoken good concerning His people here. Until our Lord returns for us or we go to be with Him, we shall continue to have the privilege of serving Him through His church and thus enjoy the blessings of heaven.
