

Rev. Frank Hughes, Jr., to Deliver Sermons And John M. Roberts, Jr., to Direct Music

An eight-day revival is scheduled to begin in the South Norfolk Baptist Church on Sunday and will continue through Sunday, August 30. Except on Sundays, services will be held each night at 7:45 o'clock. "Do We Want a Revival" and "Cold Altars" are the sermon topics of the Rev. Frank Hughes, Jr., pastor-evangelist of the South Norfolk Baptist Church, for the 11 a. m. and 8 p. m. revival services Sunday. The announcement was made by J. D. Tripp, educational director of the church.

Other sermon topics for the week-long revival are: Monday, "Dressed-Up Sin;" Tuesday, "Tuning in on Two Worlds;" Wednesday, "An Honorable Captain Converted;" Thursday, "The Way to Heaven;" Friday, "Kadesh Barnea;" Saturday, "One More Night With the Frogs." Sunday: 11 a. m., "Christ Speaks;" 8 p. m., "Prepare to Meet God."

Mrs. Gwen Whitehurst, church organist, and Miss Betty Miles, pianist, also of the local church, will accompany the singing.

Pastor Here Six Years

The Rev. Mr. Hughes has served as pastor of the Broad Creek Village Baptist Church and has been pastor of the South Norfolk congregation for more than six years. Before graduation from the Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, Fort Worth, Tex., in 1943, he completed his undergraduate degree at Wake Forest College. He was born in Currituck County, N. C.

John M. Roberts, music director for the church, and his sister, Mrs. Gwen Whitehurst, are well-known revival musicians in the Tidewater area.

Roberts is a gospel singer and congregational song leader. Special music and the song services each night will be under his direction. Both the church choir and a large youth choir will participate. He is employed by the Norfolk and Western Railway.

Mrs. Whitehurst, who was the pianist for the 1952 Preaching Mission and who is a musician on radio and TV programs, will play the pipe organ.

Miss Betty Miles, a part of the home town talent team of four, will play the piano. She is a music education graduate from Madison College, Harrisonburg, and will complete her master of religious education degree from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, Fort Worth, Tex., next Spring.

Cottage prayer meetings have been held in four areas of the city each night during the past week. The Sunday School will conduct a day of prayer at the church on Saturday, by departments. During the revival, prayer meetings will be held in the church basement daily at 7:15 p. m.

The board of deacons of the South Norfolk Church are sponsoring and directing the evangelistic campaign.
