In addition to the above contributed for other objects the C. E. societies have assumed the care of two India famine orphans under the charge of our Foreign Board. The "other objects" for which funds have been contributed were \$16.⁰⁰ for the Galveston sufferers and \$30.⁰⁰ to help the Kiowa Christians build a church. The year has been a successful one, although we have had very few Christian helpers outside of the Mission family. We feel that substantial progress is being made toward the evangelization of these tribes.

Sill, and three Cheyennes to the Mennonite mission 3 1/2 miles from here on the Washita. There are eight persons who will put in their letters within a few weeks and there is a prospect that several will unite soon upon confession. While we have had no special spiritual awakening as yet this year, the work has been carried on regularly, and we feel that the church is in excellent condition. A new Elder, Albert Long, a Pawnee, has been added to the eldership, which gives us three Indian elders, all chiefs and men of unapproachable character. It is evident that a Christian sentiment is steadily gaining ground in these tribes. Three of the deaths

occurred at the mission. There three persons were young people, and all died happy Christian deaths.

The contribution for special objects was in behalf of the church building at our mission at Ft. Sill.
