Council (Indian Prayer Meeting). Those were

elected delegates, respectively, primaries
& secundus, to the meeting of classes
which will be held April 15, 1913, in Madison
Ave. Reformed Church, New York City.

Nov. 15

The Consistory met at the Parsonage on Wednesday evening Nov. 15. Elders, Jus. Crow and Washer, Deacons Kincaid and Fletcher, and the Pastor were present. After two prayers by Washer and Jus. Crow the following business was transacted.

The report of the Treasurer of the Church, Mr. Kincaid was given and approved. The report of the pastor relative to the Camp meeting held at Deer Creek was approved. After some time spent in counseling it was decided that Washer be urged to return at once the ten dollars borrowed from the Christian Council Fund, and that Waitan do the same with the two dollars borrowed. The next item of business was heartily approved by all present, the suggestion that we contribute as a church, one hundred dollars to the Walter C. Roe Memorial School to be built at Wilmabest. Jus. Crow, however, was appointed to consult the absent Elders in order to secure their approval of the step taken. The Consistory decided not to begin the Sunday night College Prayer Meetings, the pastor and the Deacons, however, being in favor of beginning them at once. It was decided to have the question of placing the pictures of Christ, and pictures of Dr. Roe and Rev. Arthur Zimkus, postponed until later. We decided to celebrate the memory of our Lord's death on the thirtieth of November. At this time we shall receive into our membership Mrs. Henry A. Uruwink whose letter of dismission from the Reformed Church of Farmington, Michigan was presented with the request that she be accepted as a member of the Reformed Church at Colony. The meeting was closed with prayer by W. Fletcher, Rose Kincaid and the Pastor.

Henry A. Uruwink (Pastor)

Dec. 14, 1913.

Consistory met immediately after the morning service to discuss and decide how the collections of the Christian Council should be used. We determined that these funds should be used only ^{for help} the sick whom we should judge both worthy and helpless.

Elder Waitan suggested that the consistory or a representative of the consistory be present at the opening of the Christmas boxes. We all agreed that this was a good road.

Those present were: - Elders Waitan, Jus. Crow, Washer, Deacons W. Fletcher, Mr. Rose Kincaid, Pastor, H. A. Uruwink. Meeting opened & closed with prayer.

Dec. 30.

Special meeting of Consistory was held at the lodge to discuss the advisability of having a feast on New Year's Day. It was agreed upon to hold the feast at the lodge at midnight on New Year's Day. Twenty dollars of the surplus of last summer's Camp Meeting Fund was voted for beef; the rest of the provisions to be supplied by private subscription.

Those present were Elders Jus. Crow, Washer, John Red Teeth; - Deacons W. Fletcher and Mr. Rose Kincaid; and the pastor who closed the meeting with prayer.

Jan. 26, 1914.

Consistory met in church immediately after the morning ^{service} for the purpose of nominating Elders and Deacons. Since the election of officers had been overlooked last year it became necessary to consider the nomination of four Elders and two Deacons. The Pastor, in agreement with a suggestion from Dr. Roe, proposed that all church officers should "throw away" the dances. After arguing the question for two hours the meeting was adjourned.

Jan. 25, 1914

At three o'clock all the above named officers
were present, and after a round of prayer they gave
evidence of being very much present. With
Washke leading, the Elders defended strenuously the
dances. The Pastor then asked if it were true
that a man giving a sun dance always gave
over his wife, for immoral purpose, to the medicine
chief. This the Elders stoutly denied by saying that
there was no immorality connected with the
ceremony. W. M. Fletcher, however, as convincingly
maintained that the immoral practice was
a part of the program at every sun dance. On
another question of similar nature the
consistory again divided.

The final outcome of the three hours of
stormy session was that we all felt more
closely drawn to each other. Elders Washke and
Dacon Kincaid were recommended for election for
a term of one year. Elders Wanton and two
Crows and Dacon Fletcher were recommended for
election for a term of two years. Elders Red Teeth
in view of the opposition from some of us to the
dances, preferred to "lay down" the Eldership for
a while. Because we felt convinced that
Red Teeth would be false a vow made in
honor of the Sun gods, we allowed him
without much weeping to "lay down" his office.

Feb. 27

The consistory met at the Passage at four
P. M. to discuss regular and special business.
Those present were Elder Washke; Deacons Kincaid
and Fletcher, and the Pastor. After the
opening prayer by Washke we discussed the
 advisability of having a Camp Meeting next
 summer. The consistory being in favor of holding
 these meetings the discussion arose as to when
 the meetings should be held. The question was
 laid on the table for further consideration next
 week. We then took up the revision of our
 church record which seems to have been
 neglected for many years.

The meeting was adjourned until Friday
 afternoon, March 6. Prayer was offered by each one
 of us in closing.

Mar. 17

A special meeting of the consistory
 was called to act on the request of Sisko,
 our niece's friend, who wished to use our large
 tent for their Camp Meeting. After long and
 careful consideration we decided that it would
 do us no harm for the natives to go ourselves
 to loan the tent.

The two minutes were read. Minutes were
 approved with prayer.

Mar. 21

At the regular session of Consistory on the
 afternoon of the twentieth we discussed long
 and carefully the Camp Meeting. We came to no
 conclusions whatsoever. The Pastor informed
 the members that the camp meeting would be
 held from the tent through the thirteenth of September.

The Pastor also urged the members to prepare for the occasion by raising funds for help, but also by reviving the Sunday-night prayer meetings which had been dropped about a year ago. Since the Elders delib'd with the question of raising funds the Pastor later requested Two Crows to be the chief of a Committee suggested by himself and approved by me. In the face of the bitter opposition of Washel and also in opposition to Watan and Two Crows the Pastor ordered the revival of the Sunday-night prayer meetings.

The meeting was opened and closed with prayer.

April 6, 1914

Meeting called by the Pastor for the purpose of receiving John Slaughter into the membership of the Church. All being satisfied with the Confession made, he was admitted. Meeting was opened with prayer by the Pastor, and closed with prayer by Two Crows. Those present were Two Crows, Washel, Watan and the Pastor.

June 28, 1914.

With the consent of Washel and Two Crows Mr. Samuel Long was baptized and received into full membership on June 28, 1914. The two elders were privately interviewed in regard to the matter because it was not possible to have them meet all together with Elizabeth Ureuwink, daughter of Two Crows. Mr. Long was baptized at this same service.

The third elder was so far away that we could not consult him.

Aug. 18, 1914.

Without consulting the officers individually, or in regular ^{consistory} session, a letter of dismissal was sent to Miss Anna Beckenpas who wished to join the Reformed Church in America at W. Winnebago. The Consistory was scattered, and Miss Beckenpas wanted the letter at once.

This action was approved later by the Consistory.

Sept. 13, 1914.

A consistory meeting was held at the Camp grounds before ^{the morning} church service in order to examine parents who wished to have infant children baptized and in order to examine those applying for membership. The following parents applied: William and Martha Grayson, Mary Lee Benton, Henry and Nancy North, Lydia Black Wolf and Mikah Black Wolf, Erwin and Minnie Drunkard (Ho-no-to-wa), Klaine Middle Man. Their parents took the vows satisfactorily upon them and the following children were baptized: - Maudie Winifred Grayson, Esther Benton, Geraldine North, Leonard Mikah Black Wolf, Dick, Harry & Sam Ho-no-to-wa (Drunkard), and Ralf ~~Drunkard~~ man. After examination and approval by the consistory the following adults were admitted into the church on baptism and confession of faith: - George Warden; John Black Owl; Ida North; Sophie Ho-no-to-wa (Drunkard); Nancy (Dr) Drunkard; Marie Onaho; Nora North. The following were examined and admitted into the church on confession of faith: - A. C. McDonald; Leonard Yellow Eagle; Lillie Washer; Bertha Merrick.

All the Elders, including Nahwats of the Comanche Mission, were present, also Rev. Henry Roe Cloud, Walter Bloom of the New Brunswick Theological Seminary and the Pastor. The meeting was opened and closed with prayer.

Sept. 13, 1914.

Consistory met before the afternoon meeting to examine Mrs. North and Mrs. Daisy Harrison who wished to have their daughter Lois baptized. Since Mrs. Harrison is a Chishai and sincerely censured the question, and made the promise, the daughter was received into the church as a baptized member of the ^{pastor} service. Mikah Black Wolf, Samuel Gould and Little Bird Throwing Water requested to be received into the church on confession of faith and baptism. Little Bird Throwing Water was received after a long annuit, for he is only eleven years old. Mikah Black Wolf and Sam Gould were accepted only after they promised by the grace of god to "throw away" the peyote drug habit forever. [This they publicly did when publicly received and baptized.]

Washer, Waitan, Leo Crow, Nahwats our Comanche Elder, and the pastor were present. There was prayer at the opening and at the close and during the session.

Jan. 4, 1915

A regular meeting of the consistory was held in the church on Sunday afternoon, January 3. Those present were Two Crows (Elder); Mr. Russ Kincaid and Wm. Heleku (deacon) and the pastor.

The consistory approved of sending one hundred dollars to the Women's Board of Domestic Missions, also of having the Gospel Team of young men from Childress and Haskell. It was decided to remember our Lord's death in communion service on the thirty-first of January. By unanimous consent the question of the election of new officers was postponed there being no men of character and upulation who could now fill the vacancies. The requests of John Olteby and Medicine Woman for dismissal to the Merrimite Church at Clinton were received. The consistory asked the pastor to persuade these people, if possible, to withdraw, or at least reconsider, their request. Mr. John N. Olteby's letter from the Merrimite Church of Clinton, Mo. was received by the meeting. The meeting was opened & closed with prayer.
