Remarks.

The condition of our church is excellent and the outlook most encouraging. Although some of our members give us anxiety and occasionally we find it necessary to administer discipline, the general spirit of our people is steadily improving and Christian standards are permeating the tribes. We have been especially encouraged by the results among the educated Indians, - the returned students - a class, whom we have made but slow progress until this year. At present the pastor and his wife are instructing three young Indian men with a view to the ministry. The C. E. societies have sent help to some destitute white families in the vicinity and have recently helped establish two Sunday Schools among the whites. The church has paid for its own repairs, heating, lighting and interpreting, and raised over \$100.00 toward building a new chapel for the Primary Department of the Sunday school. There is at present an earnest spiritual feeling that promises well for

the future. The C. E. societies are also supporting two famine orphans in Indian at our church schools.

Remarks.

The year just closed has been a successful one in our church. The addition to our

working force of Rev. Arthur P. Brokaw as associate pastor has greatly strengthened our hands, and under his leadership the work among the young men and boys has been steadily developed. While we have had no special out-pouring of the Spirit, there has been a steady interest manifest, and our services have been well attended.

One new feature of our work during the past year has been the establishment of the "Christian Council" - a prayer-meeting exclusively for the camp Indians, which has been well attended by them and productive of good results.

Christmas Day was appointed as a time for special gifts to the Master, and those who were undecided had been previously urged to mat that the day upon which they should give themselves to Christ. The special offering amounted to over \$50.00 and eleven persons united with the church on confession of faith. The other departments of our mission work have been greatly prospered and we feel that we have great reason for gratitude.
