Nov. 30-1919. The Consistory met at the Church after the morning service and was opened with prayer. Present: Elders Thunders Bull, Weston, Wolf Chief and Wassana, Deacons Frank Hamilton, ^{to be counting page.} and Rev. J. L. Read, presiding.

The matter of the observance of "Living Sunday" according to the custom of our church, was brought up and discussed. It was decided to appoint Sunday, Dec. 21-1919 as "Living Sunday", and that all departments of the Church and individual members be asked to make an offering as a "birth-day gift" to Jesus.

Inquiries were made by the pastor in regard to the plans of the Indians themselves for Christmas gatherings. It was reported that the Cheyennes were to have two camps near Clinton; one at Perry Reynolds's place - the "peyote camp", and the other on Heap's "Birds" place - the Christian camp.

The pastor then suggested that the Arapahoes have their gathering and camp at Calamy, and offered the use either of the church or the big log for their tree. The Arapahoes present said the matter would be taken up at once and they would let the pastor know.

After some general conversation about matters in the church during the six weeks' absence of the pastor in the east, consistory adjourned with prayer by Thunders Bull.

Dec. 14-1919. Consistory met at the call of the pastor after the morning service and was opened with prayer. Present: Thunders Bull, Weston, Frank Hamilton and Creeping Bear, with Rev. J. L. Read, presiding. The pastor stated that the Board of Foreign Missions had written a letter urging every church that had any money on hand which would send to them later to send it now, as the Board needed money very badly; and the pastor said further that he had consulted with the Treasurer Mr. Kircaldie, who said there was some money in the treasury, part of which was to be sent later to Foreign Missions.

It was decided to send \$25.00 to the Board of Foreign Missions at once.

It was decided that some new song books were needed for the church and that half the amount necessary to pay from the church treasury and the other half by the Sunday school.

The pastor conferred with the members of consistory in regard to the best time for the "Camp tree". Owing to the uncertainty of the length of the holiday, and the school the matter was left open to be decided by the pastor and other workers when all the information was at hand.

Consistory closed with prayer by Wassana.

Jan 25, 1920-

Causestony met after the morning service. Prayer was offered.

Present: Elders Thunder Bull, Wolf Chief and Waxeame; deacons Frank Hamilton and Creeping Bear. ^{and} Rev. J. L. Read, presiding. ^{full blood eyes - 20 yrs of age,} James Armstrong, was present and stated that he had been very deep in sin but when he was in prison last year he realized his need of salvation and had been thinking about being a Christian ever since. Now he had made up his mind and wanted to confess Christ and unite with the Church and live a different life. He further stated that if it was the Lord's will he wanted to be a preacher.

After a very thorough examination, and in view of the fact that his proposal to live the Christian life had been made last September at the Camp meeting, it was decided to receive him as a confession of faith and baptism on next Sunday morning service.

After some further talk on the part of Creeping Bear and some counsel by the pastor, causestony adjourned with prayer by the pastor.

Feb. 29, 1920-

Causestony met after the morning service and was opened with prayer. Present: Elders Thunder Bull, Wolf Chief and Waxeame; deacons Hamilton and Creeping Bear. Rev. J. L. Read presiding. The request from Rev. Clark Brown of the Friends' Church, Shawnee, for the letter of Miss Rilla Weck, now married and living in California was granted and the letter ordered sent.

The matter of two women members of our Church who have a notoriously bad reputation was discussed and the pastor was requested to see and talk with these two, viz: Rebecca Little Bird and Sylvia Bear Bow.

After some discussion concerning the use or practice of Indian medicine by members of the Church the Causestony adjourned with prayer by Thunder Bull.

Mar. 28, 1920

Causestony met at 2 p. m. according to the call of the pastor. Present: Elders Thunder Bull and Waxeame, and deacon Hamilton. Rev. J. L. Read, presiding, ^{and} led in prayer.

The following young people, pupils in the Government School, presented themselves as candidates for membership in the Church: Fred Standing Water, Thomas Red Bird, Sam of Creeping Bear, Laura White Justice, Minnie Harrison, and Emma Red Bird.

The pastor stated that all but one of these, Thomas Red Bird, had been in the catechumen class

for the past three months and he felt they were ready for baptism. Unquestionably each one was given a careful examination and it was decided to receive them as candidates for baptism and public reception into the church on next Sunday, being Easter; except in the case of Fred Steuding later whose parents belong to the Methodist Church at Hammon. The pastor was requested to write the pastor of the Hammon Church and ask him to ascertain the wishes of Fred's parents in the matter, and if they consented he could be received as a member of this church.

After some further questions and words of counsel by Thumber Bull, the right hand of Christian fellowship was extended, and the Consistory adjourned with prayer by Thumber Bull.

Apr. 2, 1920 The Consistory met at the call of the pastor in the "Little Church" at 7:30 p.m. and was opened with prayer. Present: Elders Thumber Bull, Weston and Wassenaar; Deacon Frank Hamilton, and Rv. J. L. Read, presiding.

The following presented themselves as candidates for membership in the church: Gower Deaux, Fred North and Benjamin Ellis - the latter a member of the Pima Tribe in Arizona. After a careful examination it was decided that they should be received into the church on profession of their faith in Christ.

The pastor stated that he had written to the missionary to the Pimas in Arizona and had ascertained the fact that Benjamin Ellis had been baptized as a child in the Presbyterian mission at Acetone.

The following Sunday (Easter) all of the above named, including those examined on Feb. 28th were publicly welcomed into the Church, all receiving baptism except Benjamin Ellis. The Consistory adjourned with prayer -

May 16-1920. The Consistory met after the morning service and was opened with prayer.
Present: Elders Wetan, Wassauer, Wolf Chief and Thunder Bull; deacons Creeping, Bear and Frank Hamilton. Rev. J. L. Read presided.

The pastor presented the church letter of 200. Isaac Van Helst from the Jefferson Avenue Presbyterian Church, Detroit, Mich. and he was received as a member of the Calvary Church.

The matter of whether we should arrange for a dinner on the grounds at the closing of the Government School was discussed. The pastor was requested to confer with the Agent about the matter. Consistory adjourned with prayer by Wassauer.

May 30- The Consistory met at 12 m. in the church and prayer was offered.
Present: Elders Wetan, Wassauer and Wolf Chief; deacons Creeping, Bear and Hamilton. Rev. J. L. Read presided.

The pastor spoke of the passing away of Thunder Bull, who had been a member and an elder in this church for a long time, and stated that he thought it would be a good idea to draw up a paper expressing our sorrow at his death and testifying to his faithfulness as a Christian man and an officer in the church. It was decided to do this and

the pastor was requested to prepare the paper.

After report by the pastor of his conference with the Agent, Mr. Smith, it was decided to try to arrange for the dinner on the grounds at the close of school, June 13.

The Consistory closed with prayer.
