Today we use this word to speak of a picture, a book, a song, or a mountain, Yellowstone Park, Niagara Falls, the Grand Canyon - we call these wonderful. An yet this word is inadequate even when it is used to describe what happened 2000 years ago when the star stood over the manger in Bethlehem. The shepherds watched their flocks on the plains, and Rome then ruled the world. And America at that time was nothing but an unknown wilderness. And even France and England were barbarian at that time.

Is there not something truly wonderful about the fact that after almost 2000 years that we should be gathered here today to observe the Lord's Supper, in remembrance of Jesus who was called wonderful by Isaiah.

There have been many wonders in the world. And of course at one time, people recognized seven great wonders in the world. But today, I want to talk to you about the seven wonders of Jesus Christ. I really don't think that half has ever been told about Jesus.

I. HE WAS WONDERFUL IN HIS BIRTH

When the fullness of time came, and the clock of eternity struck the hour, it is time for my son to leave the glory of Heaven, and go down to earth and redeem men from sin. And how would be send him. Would be send him as an angel, or as a mighty king, or as a full-grown man. He decided to send him as a tiny babe. He decided to let him grow up to manhood in the normal way. That he might have all the trials and the temptations of the normal man.

God looked and found a good woman to be the one to bring his son to birth. He decided on Mary, a devoted, dedicated young woman - pure in heart, and lovely in life.

Now God calls Cabriel to go down and tell Mary that she is going to bear a child. That he will be called the son of God. And she ask, how can this happen. And he tells her that the Holy Spirit will bring it all to pass. And he also tells her what the name of the child will be - he will call him Jesus. No other birth had ever occurred like this. He had only one human parent. But he inherited the nature of God and of man. And he came to be the king of kings. The message was also given to Joseph, to whom Mary was to be married. And they accepted the responsibility to become these two people of God.

And when the time arrived, they journeyed to Bethlehem. And that starrey night the chorus sang, Glory to God in the Highest — and the son of God came into the world. He was born, and there was no room in the inn. They placed him in a manger. And yet the angels proclaimed his birth with joy. They aroused the sleeping shepherds who were guarding the flocks.

What a wonderful and a wonder - the virgin birth. Since Adam and Eve came into the world, no child had ever been born except through the fusion of a man's nature and a woman. But no man had anything to do with the birth of Jesus. God himself, brought this to pass. So in Heaven, he was with the Father, but in Bethlehem he was there cared for by Mary and Joseph.

It was a miraculous birth - it was not in a palace or a golden eradle - or with angels for nurses. He gave up all the glory and was born of a poor woman. And cradled in a manger. The wise men, led by his star, soon made his birth known. And the king sought his life.

There had never been a birth like that of Jesus. He was wonderful in his birth.

That is the first wonder.

II. THE WONDER OF HIS LIFE.

There are several things in the New Testament that describe the life and the character of Jesus. And they help us to know how wonderful his life was. No other other approached it in perfection.

First, he never committed a single sin. Peter said that Christ was a man who did no sin. Neither was gile found in his mouth. Webrew says, he was in all points tempted like we, as we are. Yet without sin.

There have been some good men in the world but there has only been one perfect man, the man Jesus Christ. No one could point to him and say one bad thing about his life. You call him out and examine him today from every standpoint. Did you ever hear an evil word that Jesus said - no. Did he ever do a wrong thing - no. Did he ever think a sinful thought - no. You and I must say with Pilate. I can find no fault with this just man.

at a certain hour. He did not announce the name of the deceased. A large crowd of people gathered. The casket stood before the pulpit and flowers were piled up, on every side. The preacher did not eulogize the dead. But he stated that he had committed every known sin. He was a very wicked person. And he talked about the end of sin and the wages of sin. And when he had finished his sermon, he invited the person to file past the casket, and look at the horrible sinner.

As the people looked, they saw that the casket was empty. But a mirror was placed in the casket - thus every man and woman saw only themselves. The preacher was simply saying, they were sinners. But when you look at Jesus and you hold a microscope over his life - you cannot find any sin.

The second thing to notice is that he performed many wonderful miracles. This is a wonder of his life and character. He touched the blind and they were able to see. He touched the lame, and they were able to walk. He cleansed the leper, he stilled the storms, he brought the dead back to life. His life was simply filled with things never done before or since. All because of the power of Heaven in him.

Today there are scores of faith healers in this land of ours. And they testify that from tents, radio, and T. V., that they can perform miracles. But our hospitals and our nursing homes are filled with suffering people. If these people can heal so easily, why don't they go to these hospitals and relieve suffering, of the thousands of people who need healing.

We remember third, that he went about doing good. Many people today, go about, but they are not doing any good. Jesus was goodness in action. Every mile he traveled was filled with good things - that he was doing for other people.

Pr. Albert Sweitzer the great missionary, was scheduled to speak in one of our cities. A delegation of the most prominent men of the city went to meet him when he got off of the train. They rushed forward to greet him - they were going to make some speeches, take some pictures etc. But as they neared him, he said, excuse me gentlemen - and then he went over to an old lady and picked up her bundles and carried them out for her and saw that she was put safely in a cab. Then he came back to the dumb-founded committee. Now, surely - this is an instance - a slight picture of Jesus who went about doing good.

Fourth, he spoke as never man had spoken refore. This doe's not mean that his eloquence and his speaking ability exceeded other people. But that what he had to say was a wonder - and it was wonderful in that it was so different.

He came and he told men about a loving God. He told them of things that would make life worthwhile. He told them that he would be a daily companion with them — in life and in death. He told them the way of salvation. He told about a glorious Heaven for people that were prepared for it. He got down where men lived — and he touched them at the point of their greatest need.

You can hear the ringing blows of the hammers as the great nails go through his hands and feet. And then the thud of the cross as it drops into the hole prepared for it.

Six long hours he hangs there on that cross. Finally at 3 o'clock in the afternoon, he cries - it is finished. He commends his spirit to God and died.
