

## VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL AT BROAD CREEK VILLAGE

According to the standard for Vacation Bible School as used throughout the Southern Baptist Convention, our school made a grade of AA. Mrs. John C. Huff, pastor's assistant, was principal of the school.

Preparation day included a parade through the Village escorted by police. Including our workers we had 241 in this parade. It was truly a beautiful sight—streamers, bright head and arm bands, flags, etc. At the end of the parade each child was served ice cream. All of the activities for each department were carefully planned and carried out.

Rev. P. Rowland Wagner, pastor of Central Baptist Church in Norfolk, gave a memorable message on Thursday of the last week. On this occasion many of the boys and girls expressed a real interest in Christ. Some of these have united with the church, which is proof that a plain message of the gospel by Brother Wagner touched many hearts.

Rev. Mott. A. Cumby, on vacation from the Southwestern Seminary, helped in a marvelous way in the last three days of the school. He taught the Bible study for the Intermediates Wednesday through Friday in the absence of the pastor. He addressed the entire school in assembly on Friday and assisted with the commencement that night.

Our enrollment for the entire school (those attending 2 days or more) was 381. This total includes 7 who were enrolled in a nursery class. The average attendance for the ten days including preparation day was 282.

A mission offering for relief totaling \$69.76 was received from the daily offering.

We would not magnify the large figures as recorded by the school, but give thanks for those who were saved through its ministry.
