

JAPANESE PLANS.

INVASION OF AUSTRALIA AND AMERICA.

Story of Secret Documents.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 12.—The Washington bureau of the North American Newspaper Alliance says that a sensational file of secret Japanese documents entitled "Three-Power Alliance and American-Japanese War" reveals in detail the Japanese war plan, which is to reach its climax with a simultaneous invasion of the Panama Canal Zone, Alaska, California, Oregon and Washington State.

The documents were obtained clandestinely last year by an anti-Japanese Korean patriot, Kilsoo Haan, from the possession of a high officer of the Japanese Black Dragon Society in a Los Angeles hotel. Mr. Haan sent to Washington abstracts

from the documents in the English language and is now preparing a full translation in English.

The documents forecast in detail Japan's feigned peace negotiations while preparing for the attack on Hawaii and the subsequent action against the Philippines. According to the documents, the war will include three stages.

The first stage is scheduled for four months. It includes occupation of the Philippines, Guam, Wake, Midway, Hong Kong, Borneo and Malaya.

In the second stage, Japan is to occupy, for her protection in the south, the Netherlands East Indies, Australia and New Zealand and also, for her protection from the rear, Burma and India. Japan then proposes to establish strategic positions for assaulting the United States by seizing Kamchatka (north-eastern Russia) and all the Pacific islands.

The third stage consists of invasion of the United States, but in the documents it is expected that the United States will ask for peace after the fall of Hawaii and all its other Pacific territories.
