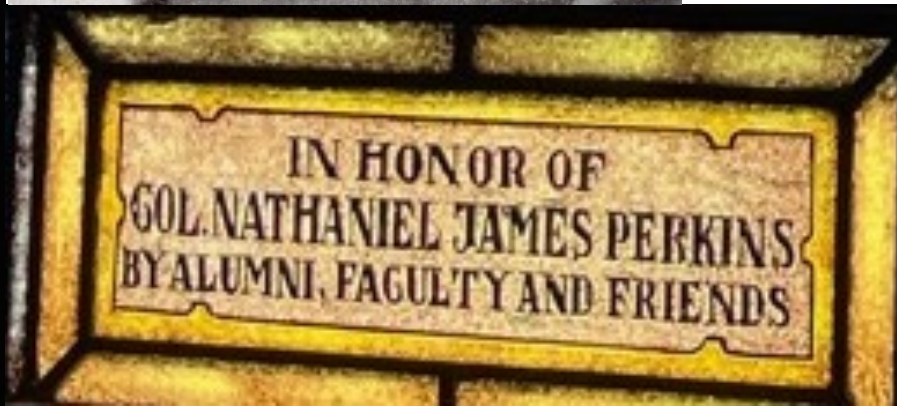
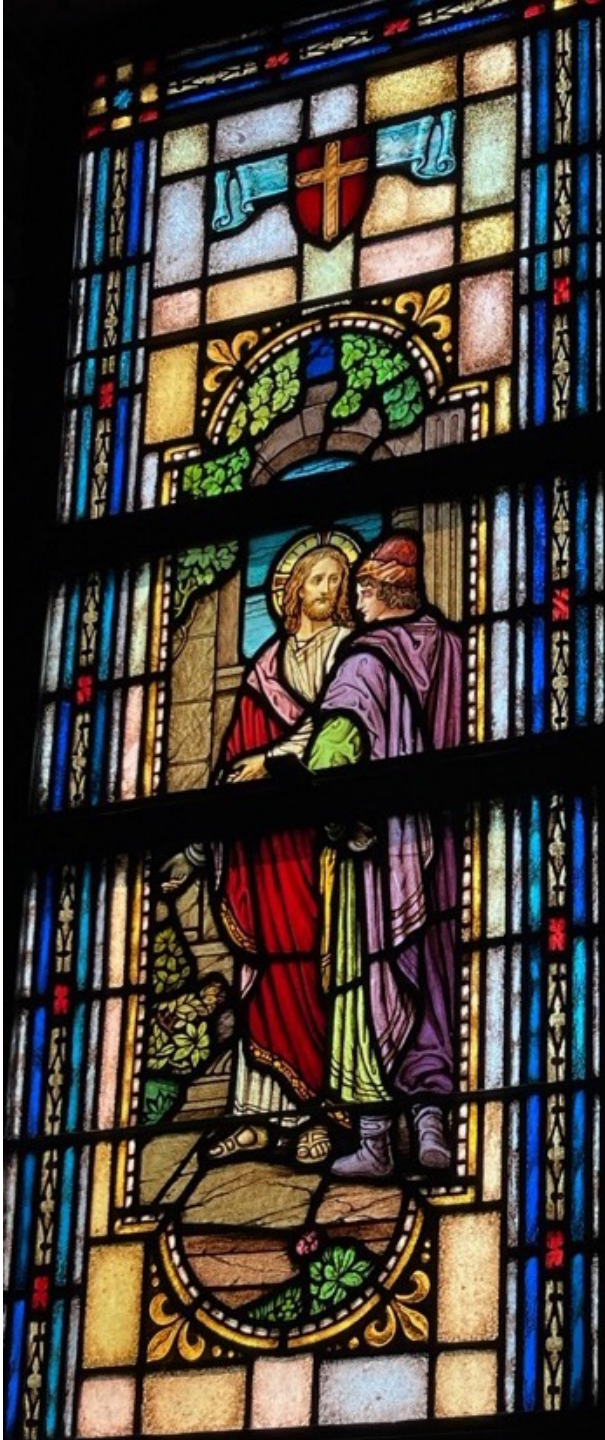
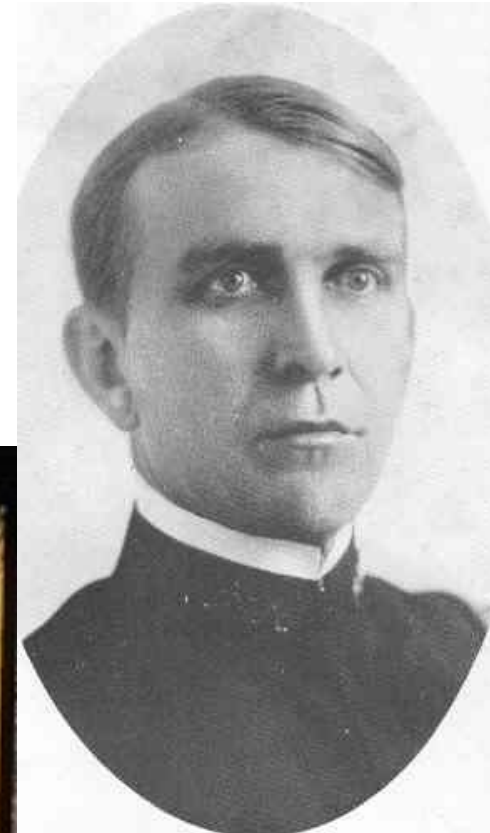


# COL PERKINS WAS A FORMER PRESIDENT OF FORK UNION



# Fork Union Academy Headmaster Is Married Here

The marriage of Mrs. Elda Elizabeth Hare of Chevy Chase, Md., to Colonel Nathaniel J. Perkins, headmaster of Fork Union Military Academy and member of the General Assembly of Virginia, was solemnized here yesterday at noon in the home of Dr. and Mrs. John J. Wicker in Westover Hills. The ceremony was performed by Dr. Wicker, who is president of Fork

Union Military Academy and Dr. J. J. Carmock.

The bride's costume was a black and white sheer ensemble with white accessories, and her corsage was of orchids and lilies of the valley. There were no attendants, and only immediate relatives were present.

After a brief wedding journey, Colonel and Mrs. Perkins will be

at home in Hatcher Hall on the campus at Fork Union.

Mrs. Perkins, daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. W. H. Wright of Germantown, Pa., was the widow of Dr. Francis Hare of Washington, Pa. She has three sons, one of whom is now attending the University of Maryland, another St. Albans School for Boys in Washington, and another Fork Union.

Colonel Perkins, who has been associated with the school at Fork Union for more than 20 years as head of the academic department, has been actively identified with the major policies of the school throughout the time, and was for a number of years its president.

He is a graduate of Denison University, Ohio, and did his early teaching in Sandford, Fla.

In the House of Delegates Colonel Perkins sits for the Counties of Fluvanna and Goochland and in the session of 1938 served as chairman of the library committee and member of the committee on schools and colleges.

# Col. Perkins, 84, Dies in Richmond

FORK UNION—Col. Nathaniel James Perkins, 84, retired headmaster of Fork Union Military Academy and former member of the State Board of Welfare and Institutions, died yesterday in Richmond.

Col. Perkins moved to Richmond two years ago from Fork Union and lived at 14 Malvern Manor. His home in Fluvanna County was destroyed by fire in 1958.

He served as president of the academy from 1918 to 1930. From 1930 until his retirement in 1948, he was headmaster.

Col. Perkins had represented Fluvanna and Goochland counties in the House of Delegates.

In 1958, he was awarded a pin by the U.S. Government for serving as chairman of the Fluvanna County Selective Service Board for 15 years.

He resigned from the State Board of Welfare early this year after being a member since 1950.

A native of Fluvanna County, he was born May 31, 1877, son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Isaac O. Perkins. He married the former Elda Wright, who survives.

Col. Perkins was an alumnus of Denison University at Granville, Ohio, where he was a member of the Beta Fraternity.

He was a past master of Masonic Lodge No. 127, AF&AM, of Fork Union.

Surviving in addition to his wife, are two step-sons, William H. Hare of Kansas City and Francis A. Hare of Richmond; one daughter, Mrs. Leroy White of Fork Union; one brother, Robert C. Perkins of Fork Union, and two sisters, Mrs. Louise Strathy of Richmond and Mrs. S. P. Harland of Winter Park, Fla.

The funeral will be held at 2 p.m. Monday at Fork Union Military Chapel. Burial will be in Bethel Cemetery in Fluvanna County.
