

From the Minutes of the North Carolina State Baptist Convention:

THIRD DAY—MORNING SESSION.

GREENSBORO, N. C., Dec. 7, 1906.

J. H. Tucker, for the Committee, made the following report, which was adopted:

Your Committee appointed a year ago on Permanent Assembly Ground beg leave to report:

1. We have secured an option on 940 acres of land at the Swannanoa Tunnel, through which passes the main line of the Southern Railway from Washington to Memphis. The site has been personally inspected by your Committee and we believe it to be admirably adapted to the purpose.

2. We recommend that the Convention, without assuming any financial responsibility, give its endorsement to the establishment of these grounds.

3. We further recommend that the Baptists of the South be invited to join in the movement.
