OBITUARIES

REV. LEONARD T. GILL

Rev. Leonard Thurston Gill, pastor of the Pageland, S. C. Presbyterian church since 1935 and two nearby rural churches, Beulah and Salem, died at his home in Pageland early Friday morning of a heart attack. Funeral services were held in the First Presbyterian church, Monroe, Sunday at 4 p. m., and burial was in Sharon Memorial park near Charlotte.

The services were in charge of Rev. R. H. Stone, Charlotte, general secretary of Mecklenburg presbytery, assisted by Rev. Robert Turner, pastor of the First Presbyterian church of Monroe.

Pallbearers were W. E. Price, Fred Dickinson, A. D. Biggs, Rev. W. T. Smith, Rev. W. G. Thomas and Rev. Q. N. Huneycutt.

The elders and deacons of the three churches acted as honorary pallbearers.

Rev. L. T. Gill was born in Bridgworth, England, March 12, 1872. He was the son of Joshua and Mariah Norton Gill, both deceased. He is survived by his wife who was Miss Gladly Tucker, formerly of Monroe. They were married October 6, 1934. He is also survived by a daughter, Ruth, child of a former marriage.

Mr. Gill after receiving his training in Gloucester University school in England, where he received his A. B. degree, moved to Texas in 1902 where he was a student in Texas State university in 1902-1905, and at the same time, he attended the Presbyterian seminary at Austin, Texas. He was ordained by West Texas presbytery in 1905, and became pastor at Beeville, Texas. Later in Texas he became pastor at Waxahachie, evangelist and superintendent of home missions at Amarillo until 1911, when he moved to North Carolina and became superintendent of home missions in Mecklenburg presbytery. He first lived in Wadesboro, and later in Charlotte until 1925.

From 1925 to 1934 he was inactive, and resumed his ministerial services when he supplied Marshville group and then took charge at Pageland in 1935 he served until his death.

Mr. Gill had been in declining health for a year or two, but had continued his active service, through the assistance of his wife, who accompanied him wherever he went, and drove the automobile.

Rev. Mr. Gill was a 33rd degree Mason, and Masons will participate in the funeral services.

Leonard Thurston Gill

Born in England, he immigrated to the U.S. in 1883.

--He married Mary Dudley in 1890. She was a native of Mississippi. They lived in Gonzales County, TX in 1900, in Amarillo, Potter County, TX in 1910 & were in Charlotte, NC in 1920. They had 5 children, but 4 died young. The only survivor was daughter Ruth, born in 1896.

--His wife Mary died in 1931. She was buried in Greenville, Mississippi.
