## THE DIETY OF CHRIST

John 20:28

"And Thomas answered and said unto Him, 'My Lord and my God.'"

## INTRODUCTION

Suppose anybody should talk like that to you and call you their

Lord and their God. What would you say? You would say, "Excuse me, sir, but
you are a much mistaken man."

You remember what Peter said to Cornelius. Cornelius was about to worship Peter. Peter took him by the hand and said, "Stand up, for I also ama a man as thou art."

But did you ever notice that Jesus never rebuked Thomas; He accepted his worship and commended him for it. And when he did it, He was just what Thomas said He was - His Lord and his God.

Who was Jesus? Do you know there is not another question in all the realm of human thought so important as this one unless it is the question of what you are going to do with Jesus after you find out who He is.

There are problems connected with of course with the person of Jesus, which no human intellect has ever fathomed or ever will. The greatest minds of the world have grappled with His diety and His incarnation and the general mystery that surrounds His personality. But they have said one and all that their explorations

have been like those of Sir Isaac Newton who in his search after knowledge said he seemed like a school boy walking by the seashore picking up pebbles here and there while the vast deep rolls unexplored at his feet.

There is no doctrine that's been pounded like this one. Of course, we know that we can't agree on every little thing, but I have no patience really with those heresy hunters who are always whittling away on theology and splitting hairs over views about different doctrines.

But when it comes to one thing on which the whole system of our Christian religion rests, the diety, the divinity of Jesus Christ, we must be of one mind. The fundamental truth must be accepted. Deny this and you knock the keystone out of the ark and the whole thing comes down with a crash.

But now some fellow would say, but you are confusing your terms when you talk about diety and divinity. Well, MAXERNA perhaps let me give you something about the difference between the two. There is but one who is divine, and he is God. And if Christ is God, if the apostle John was right when he was said the word was God and the Word was made flesh and dwelt among us, then Christ and Christ alone was divine as God is divine.

(If a difference between diety and divinity was admitted, let it not be

the kind of difference that some people want to make. The difference that makes Jesus

less than He really is. The Unitarian says, "I believe Christ was divine." But how do you believe that He was divine? I can believe that He arose. And a Unitarian can say, "I believe that a rose is divine" - or even a cat. But he says you know that if you don't know it, hear it now and never for forget it. Christ is divine just as any other man is divine - that is, He has no distinctive divinity. He had a divinity peculiar to Himself such as other men do not have. He was a good man, the best man that ever lived. In this sense, he had more divinity than any other man ever had, but it was only the same kind of divinity that you and I ourselves have.

Now if that isn't a true and fair representation of the Unitarian position of Christ, then I just can't read the English language in black and white. But that at once robs Jesus of His Saviourhood. It really strips Him of His power to redeem.

Now, I want a God to be my Saviour. You know what the (unbelievers) of this world have tried to outdo each other in applauding the character of Jesus Christ.

Pilate called Him the man without fault. Diderot called Him the unsurpassed.

Napoleon called Him the Emperor of Love.

David Strauss called Him the Highest model of religion.

John Stewart Mill called Him the Guide of Humanity.

Leckey Liceke called Him the highest pattern of virtue.

Pecant called Him the Holy One before God.

Renan called Him the greatest among the sons of men.

Theodore Parker called Him the youth with God in His heart.

Francis Cobe called Him the regenerator of humanity

Robert Owen called Him the irreproachable.

But none or all of these will do. Doesn't the Bible make it plain enough and doesn't your own conviction agree with it that no man however great, wise or good can ever save his own soul, much less the soul of any other man.

Once a man was questioning the Unitarian minister. He said to W him,
"Is the Bible the infallible Word of God?" He said "No, it is the fallible WEER
word of man." The fixer friend said, "Who was Jesus Christ?" He said "He was
a good man who lived in Palestine."

The friend said, Then He was not your Saviour."

The minister answered, "No." And the friend said, "Have you got a

Saviour?" And he said, "Yes." The friend said, Who is He?" And the Unitarian

minister said, "I am my own Saviour."

He was painfully consistent with nothing else, but that is the place where every man must stand who robs the only begotten Son of God of His diety and denies Him any distinctive divinity.

But now on the scene comes the fool and says "It's a mystery. This thing of the diety of Christ - let it alone. You can't believe what you can't understand."

Well, so far as believing what you can't understand, don't you know you do that every day?

are other mysteries that you can let them alone, but this one you can't. Man is a religious animal, and he simply can't shake off his religious instincts. And right at the center of the religions which faces every civilized human being is the person of Jesus Christ. What do you think of Me, Jesus says. Who do men say that I am? That is the challenge of Christ Himself, and you can't evade it. You may try to, but (f you have never done any careful thinking about Jesus Christ, I want you to think about Himmow. If there ever was a time when both the world and the church needed a clear, clean affirmation of the fundamental fact upon which Christianity rests and without we have nothing more than a creed as insipid and lifeless as a humanitarian.

What about the social unrest of our day? And the anarchists crying "To hell with social order." The criminal decrying responsibility for extistence. The toiling struggling masses clamoring against what they believe to be the unjust and pathetic w inequalities of the present day was economic system.

Some ministers preach as if this was a thing no longer messential to the Christian faith. Our churches are filled with members who know little if any difference between the Unitarian church and their own. Why is this? It is because we preachers have been remiss in defining the faith.

Sometimes people are so mixed up in their churches that they feared

friction might be the result. Of course we need to get the message of God, but until the we absolutely uncompromisingly distinguish between some of these cults and the real faith in Jesus Christ, we will have the problems. The Bible writers that claimed that Christ was divine, and that Christ himself claimed to be divine in the sense that no other man can be divine, there can be absolutely no doubt whatsoever.

Isaiah 9:6 called Him a Mighty God, the Everlasting Father.

John 1:1-14 said, the Word was God and the Word was made flesh and dwelt among us.

I. As to His divine knowledge he said no man knoweth the son but the father, and no man knoweth the father but the son, and he to whomsoever the son will reveal him."

Matt. 11:27

What a daring, what a tremendous statement. How profane, how shocking if he were only a man. Would any mere man dare to say that he knew God as well as God knew him? Would you?

II. As to His divine power. Among other things He said kx these three.

Whatsoever things the Father doeth, these also doeth the Son likewise. What man ever used language so daring as that to claim the full right and the power to do all that the Eternal Father had the right and the power to do?

Second, that He had the power to raise the dead. "As the Father raiseth up the dead and quickeneth them, even so the Son quickeneth whomsoever he will."

He said He would raise up His own body. John 2:19-21. And that the day was coming when all the dead would hear his voice and come forth out of their graves. How could he do this if He were not God in some sense that no other man had ever been?

Third, that He had power to forgive sins. He said so in so many words.

The Jews were right when they asked, Who can forgive sins but God only? But Christ not only claimed the right and the power to do so, but he emphasized his claim and proved it by a miracle.

III. As to His divine authority whe said in the plainest terms that He will be the universal judge at the last day. He said the Father judgeth no man, but hath committed all judgment unto the Son. He says that He will sit on the throne of His glory, and all shall be gathered before Him.

Now what mortal could say things like these? Who is this that professes to be able to search the EKEKERE secret motives of men? To KEE sit in judgment upon their words, their deeds, and claims the authority to grasp and to send divine thunder bolts of retribution if He is not something more than a man? Did man ever make such a claim? Would you a man dare to make it?

- He said that He was sinless. He said, Which one of you convinceth me of sin? Could you or any other man say that?
- He not only allowed Thomas to worship Him as Lord and God, but He distinctly said in so many words, All men should honor the Son even as they honor the Father.

Could you a man say that about yourself?

- He says He is coming again in the clouds with great glory. Could you a man say that?
- He said He is going to bring His holy angels with Him. How many angels are you, a man, going to bring with you?
- A man who can read the New Testament and not see that Christ claims to be more than a man can look all over the sky at high noon on the a cloudless my day and not see the sun.

I know that you say, Didn't Jesus say, My Father is greater than I?

Yes, and God was greater than Jesus was in his humanity. Because if Jesus was only
a man, what need was there that he should tell us that His Father was greater than
He was?

Now, let's go a little further. (Why) do I believe in the divinity and the diety of Jesus Christ?

First, for the reasons just given. Because the Bible writers said
He was divine, and because Christ himself claims that He was divine.

In the second place, I believe it because of His matchless character.

He never for a single second wavered in the most sublime way in which He lived. He really delivered the goods, we would say. His was God-like kikks life was His answer to every questioning and uncertain soul.

He was born in a peculiar race and in a peculiar age. The whole world in our age as well as His has found Him its ideal to every spiritual appeal.

Every man has some good points, but Jesus Christ had them all, and He had them all in which absolute perfection. He was the only impenitent man that ever lived, and He died that way. He prayed for others and said, "Father forgive them."

But you never read where Jesus prayed for Himself, and said, "Father, forgive me."

Because there was nothing in life which He had to be forgiven of. And so that matchless character of Jesus helps me to believe in His diety.

Third, I believe in it because of His masterly teaching.

He spoke as never man spoke. That's what the officers said when they came to arrest Him. And they were right. If the books that have been written about His words were gathered up, they would fill a thousand congressional libraries, but His words alone would hardly make a vest pocket addition. But therextheir their heights

have never been scaled, and their depths have k never been sounded.

Now, the infidel comes along and sets up the teachings of Confuscius and Buddha over against that of Jesus Christ. But you can work challenge the comparison.

And we know that great truths fell from the lips of non-Christian religions, and that many water ethical utterances worthy of profound admiration. But we have worked water conceded too much.

Now, if Mr. Uthant, one of the head leaders in the United Nations, can stand up and say that I owe all of my success in life to Buddha, why can't we as Christians stand up and say that owe everything we have to Jesus Christ? Take the reachings of Jesus Christ about the great fundamental ethical concepts, such as love, truth, purity, beauty. Where in non-Christian religions or non-Christian teachers did you ever hear such moral philosophy that is so profound, so radiant, so work God-like? It came from the heart and the mind of the marvelous man of Galilee who was a master teacher.

proof of the diety of Jesus & is just Christianity itself. What did Darwin mean when he said, "A man about to be shipwrecked on some unknown coast will devoutly pray that the lesson of the missionary will have reached that far"? He meant that where the gospe has not gone, civilization has not gone. And such a shipwrecked man would likely find himself in the soup of a hungry tribe of husky cannibals.

I remember once Dr. Connor said something about the philosophy akent around the diety of Jesus Christ that some people tried to teach. He said they reminded him of a man in a dark room, chasing a black cat that isn't there at all.

That they have no light of Jesus Christ at all. You take Jesus Christ and Christianity out of civilization. Take it out of art, out of music, out of literature, and most of all out of the human heart and life, and you would have mighty little left worthy of the name.

Confuscinism, and Buddhism, Mohammedism have proven by their results that their founders were not divine, but to account for Christianity on any other basis than divinity is a historical impossibility.

You might as well say that I'll take a candle and illuminate the earth and do away with the sun.

What Jesus Christ always has been He is today - the Transformer of the world's life and Resonstructor of human society. He is the one master and by this we know that he is divine because of kt His marvelous influence.

In the fifth place, I believe in the diety of Jesus Christ MERNAS because of His mighty works.

Now, Jesus said, The works that I do bear witness of me that the Father hath sent me.

Look at this miracle - like Nicodemus, you will have to say that God was incarnate in the man who did such wonderful things.

Look at the greatest of all miracles - his resurrection. There is no better fact in history. I am more certain that Jesus xs rose from the dead than I am that there ever was a Declaration of Independence in this country, or a civil war ever fought.

But greater after all of these are the miracles of His grace. These He is doing today as in the days of old.

He is redeeming all kinds of people, the good, or rather what we call the good, as well as the bad. He takes the rich and he shows them how really poor and naked they are.
