Some young folks who are entering school, do not like this idea, because they think school is all make believe, and the job is the reality, but school is in reality part of job of life. It is like two steamers taking on coal for a long voyage across the ocean. One leaves the harbor with a half supply. The second remains in port until ample supply is aboard, and out in mid ocean, the one who had plenty of fuel aboard continues on her journey, and the other is delayed. Therefore, getting a good education is like staying long enough for an ample amount of fuel to make this journey. That is what we go to school for, that is what we get an education for. To learn to think, and then to use our thinking in making a successful and useful life.

Many of our young people today are interested in taking a short cut and they are paying dearly for this type of thing. There are some who have a great desire to get an automobile or some other covetous possession

and in doing so, forego their further education, in order that they might have something that is immediate and of seemingly tremendous importance. But this is like ~~Sam~~ selling his birthright to Jacob, for a bowl of soup. It is not understanding the proper sense of values which lead to disastrous consequences in the future. So therefore, young people should avoid taking jobs in preference to going on and getting an adequate education, because unprepared individuals are destined to be limited in their range of opportunities and in their positions in life.

Education may be expensive but it is worth what it costs. Young people of America are very fortunate in having available to them public school educational systems that provide training through the 12th grade without cost to the individual. And today higher education is provided in a large number of denominational public and state conducted universities and professional schools, and the expense to the student varies in the different institutions. The cost today may vary from \$750 to \$1500 a year for a nine month school term on some of the campuses. (This may seem very expensive.)
