## Rev. G. T. Waite, Baptist Leader, Dies in Richmond

RICHMOND, Va., May 16.—(P)—Rev. George Thomas Waite, D. D., general secretary of the Baptist Board of Missions and Education of Virginia, died yesterday at his home here after a five week's illness. He was 52 years old.

Dr. Waite was pastor of the Barton Heights church here for 12 years before assuming the post with the mission board. He served other pastorates at Herndon, Va., and Marion, Ala.

He was born September 22, 1883, in Caroline county, the son of Henry W. and Virginia Faulkner Waite, both of Spotsylvania county.

Dr. Waite, twice married, is survived by his second wife, the former Miss Mildred Davis, of Herndon, one son, George Waite, Jr., a daughter Miss Elizabeth Waite; two brothers, W. P. and C. L. Waite, of Thornburg, and an aunt, Miss Fannie L. Faulk-

ner, of Blanton.
